5. Events After the Balance Date

On 11 March 2020, the World Health Organisation declared the outbreak of COVID-19 (a novel Coronavirus) a pandemic. Two weeks later, on 26 March, New Zealand increased its COVID-19 alert level to level 4 and a nationwide lockdown commenced. On 28 April, level 4 transitioned to level 3. As part of this lockdown the Trust's activities have been reduced. While the disruption is currently expected to be temporary, there is a level of uncertainty around the duration of the period of this service reduction. At this time, the full financial impact of the COVID-19 pandemic is not able to be determined.
